The Maths Ambassadors made sure everything was up-to-date and in top working order for the visit of Jo Millard (Our Assessor for the Mark). After a full morning of analysing paperwork and measuring what impact the new and exciting strategies had had on the school, Jo then interviewed the Maths Ambassadors and then spoke to me (Mr. Morland) and both Mrs. Peach and Miss. McLoughlin, and I am delighted to announce that Jo awarded Malvern the highest possible grade of Gold! An amazing achievement with 4 areas of key strength:*

1. **Maths Ambassadors and their passion and commitment to their role.**
2. **The school Maths website which is updated weekly**
3. **The Numeracy Champion and how Maths is being driven in the school**
4. **The Maths calendar full of events to bring Maths to life.**

A very important part of the Gold Award are the [Maths Ambassadors](#) and how they influenced a lot of pupils to change their opinions of Maths and relish the challenges it can bring. So far, this academic year they have:

- Set up and maintained a Challenge Board in Key Stage 2
- Ran a whole-school Maths Competition— awarding prizes to the best 3.
- Hosted a Grandparents' Games Day which was one of the most successful aspects of the LCQM
- Ran 2 inter-school Maths Competitions at Malvern.
- Host bi-weekly Maths Assemblies.
- Award Mathematician of the Week in Assemblies to 4 children.
- Work in Key Stage 1 classes helping younger children with their understanding of Maths.
- Working as Maths Buddies to 9 Year 5 children who are working with Mr. Morland as part of a Maths Case Study.
- Assisted and helped run the Parent Maths Workshops this half-term
- Planned an Enterprise Day and hand delivered letters to local businesses to support the event
- Written Maths Newsletters for the school website
- Maintained a Maths Games Hub on the playground during break and lunch time
- Asked Teachers how Maths has helped them this week and write them on Help Boards for all to see
