

'The Three Wishes' by Alan Snow: This is a November book of the month on the LoveReading4Kids website. Set long ago in a country that is far off in the frozen north,

It was published last week in hardback.



'Theory of Relativity' by Carl Wilkinson & James Weston Lewis

This huge recently published information book explains Einstein's theory of relativity to general readers - and specifically to young readers. This is achieved step by step and in bite-sized chunks - with lots of illustrations to keep things accessible. It deals with Einstein's early influences and explains scientific theories and discoveries - from gravity to light waves and his understanding of space and time that provided the building blocks for his famous equation. It was published on 14/10/20 and is for age 7+.
