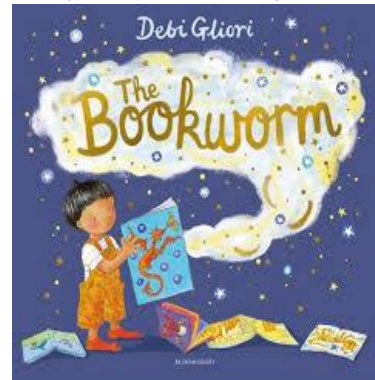


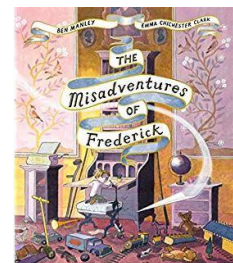

But this particular worm turns out to be very unusual when its back turns spiky and it begins to breathe smoke. Dragons don't exist - do they? A warm, family-centred story with a totally unexpected ending. It was published on 22-8-19 and is for age 3+.



'Tin Boy' by Steve Cole: This is a powerful and inspiring story that will get children thinking about the world and their place in it. Tono lives in Indonesia and though he's only a boy, he goes to work each day - swimming down to mine tin by hand from deep under the sea. He finds something on the seabed that changes his life. A gripping story. Published this week and for age 8+.

'The Misadventures of Frederick' by Ben Manley: This picture book is about a special friendship in which free-spirited Emily tempts anxious and pampered Frederick to brave the outdoors and enjoy some wonderful and unexpected adventures.
