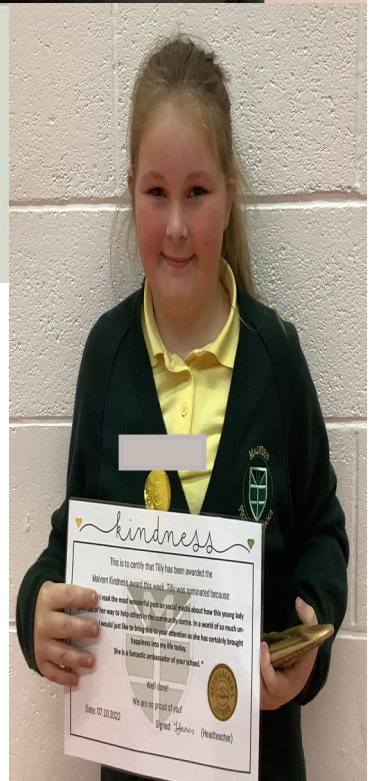
*She is a fantastic ambassador of your school. Well Done to Malvern for obviously sending out great values to your pupils.'*
