We have made a brilliant start to our walking initiative in April and

May, but we are looking to get even more people involved in the month of June.

For those of you that have to drive to school, you can still take part. If you are able to park up and walk for 10 minutes to school (park and stride) then this will add to your child's score, earning them rewards. The blue circle on the map shows roughly where you can walk from that equates to a 10-minute walk.

Polite Reminder

Our school has recently joined the Modeshift STARS National Accreditation Scheme and Knowsley Council Stars Scheme. The schemes help us to look at ways to improve walking and cycling to school and consider the positive effects it has on the physical and mental health of our students.

As part of the scheme, we have been offered the opportunity for pupils in Year 5 and Year 6 to benefit from a Bike MOT Session which will take place at school on Wednesday 21st June at 10.00am.

Students can bring their bikes into school on the day and they will be checked by a specialist bike mechanic.

Minor repairs will be carried out and if any safety issues are identified which require more extensive work – an advisory note will be provided for your information and action.

Participants will receive a cycling related item from the team at Knowsley Council to support their cycling journeys.
