Walk to School Challenge

Living Streets' WOW – the walk to school challenge is back to help encourage as many children as possible to experience the benefits of walking to school. It will officially start on Monday 11th September 2023. WOW is a pupil-led behaviour-change initiative where children self-report how they get to school every day. If they travel actively (walk/wheel, cycle, scoot or Park and Stride) at least once a week for a month, they get rewarded with a badge.

What are the benefits of walking to school?

- Children feel happier and healthier
- They arrive to school refreshed, healthy, and ready to learn
- A reduction in congestion and pollution at the school gates

What if we can't walk to school?

Remember, you can Park and Stride to help your child earn their WOW badge. Park or hop off public transport at least ten minutes away from the school and walk the rest of the way.



Bowring Park Road

We have been asked to share the following information with all stakeholders in our community:

Dear Resident,

We would like to update you regarding the planned night-time carriageway surfacing works on the Bowring Park Road. We have this scheduled to commence on the 11th September 2023 from 7pm through to 1am for approximately 4 weeks Monday to Friday.

This traffic management will be a full closure of Bowring Park Road from the Knowsley boundary at the Greystone Foot Bridge through to the Rocky Lane junction and including the junction at Chelwood Avenue for the following dates:

- 11th September to the 15th September
- 25th September to the 3rd October.

There will be a closure from the junction of Rocky Lane up to Chelwood Avenue for the following dates:

- 18th September to the 20th September
- 3rd October to the 6th October

Access to properties will be maintained however restrictions may be in place and residents may be advised to park cars on neighbouring streets when the planing and resurfacing progresses past each driveway. This can be advised during the shift by the onsite supervisors who will contact each resident in advance of starting the works.

Access to businesses will be maintained from Chelwood Avenue.

Please note, noise related operations such as the planing plant are permitted up to 11pm and asphalt installation will cease at 1am. The road will remain closed and traffic management will be removed at 4am, once the carriageway temperature has lowered and the road is safe to re-open.

Dates quoted are indicative and maybe subject to change due to circumstances beyond our control however we will provide updates accordingly.
