## Entry Task

To watch clips from various events during World War 2.

Explore and discuss: what do they tell us? What do we know? What is the impact of war?

Where does WW2 fit on a timeline compared with other periods of history?

How did World War 2 begin?

Which countries were invaded?

What sacrifices did people make?

What were the major events of the WW2?

Can I order these chronologically on a timeline?

Why did evacuation begin? What did it entail and how did it impact Britain? Is there a lasting legacy?

Historical Enquiry: Was evacuation a positive experience for all? How did evacuation impact our local community?

What was the Battle of Britain? Can I order key events? What resistance did Britain put up?

Using primary and secondary resources, how did the Battle of Britain impact humanity?

What was the Blitz and how did Britain prepare? What affect did it have on those in poverty compared to those with wealth?

What cities and ports were bombed during the Blitz? What made these places vulnerable to bombing? (Identify geographical features e.g. rivers, travel etc.)

How was Liverpool affected during World War Two? What were the long term affects on the city and our community?

Can I evaluate my final product drawing on the design criteria? Can I evaluate my peers work and suggest areas for improvement?

Can I assemble, join and combine materials creating a finished product?

Can I measure and mark out a shell structure using appropriate tools and skills, making my prototype user friendly?

Can I experiment with reinforcing and joining techniques including, scoring, cutting, assembling, strengthening and stiffening, highlighting the pros and cons of each?

Can I create a cross-sectional, annotated diagram to design a suitcase for an evacuee?

Can I research a range of shell, solid and combination structures, listing the features of each? Can I produce a 3D net of my suitcase to help me begin to think about my framework?

Who was defeated and why? How did Britain celebrate the end of the war? How did people feel when it was over and did life return to pre war normality?
