Entry Task

Children will bring an object or photograph from home with a connection to Liverpool. Children will discuss in groups what it is and its connection to Liverpool.

Can I locate the settlement of Liverpool on a map of the UK?

Can I name the nations / capital cities / regions of the United Kingdom and identify these using digital mapping?

Can I identify and label different counties of the + UK from memory?

Can I identify and label the surrounding seas and oceans on a digital map?

Using a range of maps, can I locate: Greece, France, Italy, Germany and Spain? What are the capital cities of Greece, France, Italy, Germany and Spain? What seas and oceans surround these countries?

Celebration/Evaluation

Children will create their own tour guide of Liverpool, referencing links to the slave trade and the <u>leg-</u> <u>acy</u> of this history in our city today.

Curriculum Passport Challenge

Children will visit the International Slavery Museum in Liverpool and learn the lyrics to a song by the Beatles.

What is a physical landmark?

How did physical features influence peoples decision to settle in Liverpool?

What are human features of Geography? Can I name some <u>significant</u> Liverpool landmarks? How are these influenced by our past? How did the location of Liverpool influence its significance in the slave trade?

What was the slave <u>trade</u> and when did it begin? Did slave traders show <u>compassion</u>? What were they willing to <u>sacrifice</u>?
