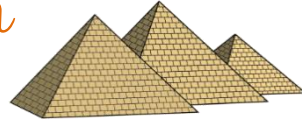




# Walk Like An Egyptian



Tutankhamun	One of the most famous Pharaohs, because of the discovery of his tomb
Nerfertiti	An Egyptian queen, wife of pharaoh Akhenaten. She ruled alongside him for 14 years.
Mummification	A process where the skin and flesh of a corpse can be preserved.
Aswan Dam	The largest dam built across the River Nile in Aswan, Egypt between 1960 and 1970. Used to control flooding of the Nile and increase farming production.

Egypt Glossary	Definition
Amulet	A type of charm believed to have magical powers
Canopic Jar	A jar to store organs during mummification
Embalm	The treatment of dead body in preparation for the after-life
Sarcophagus	Highly decorated, large, stone coffin
Delta	A triangle-shaped deposit of sand, clay or silt at the mouth of a river.
Flood plain	An area of low-lying ground alongside a river, likely to flood
Pharaoh	A ruler in Ancient Egypt.

How similar or different were the Ancient Egyptians and Greeks?	Both had a single ruler. Egyptian art linked to religion, Greek art to philosophy. Both upper-class had slaves and labourers. Both civilizations believed in Gods and Goddesses. Both believed in mythology.

The River Nile – Water supply, crop growth Cairo: Capital city on the River Nile Giza: Position of the 3 pyramids Delta: Where the Nile meets the Mediterranean Valley of the Kings: Burial place of many Pharaohs (including Tutankhamun)
