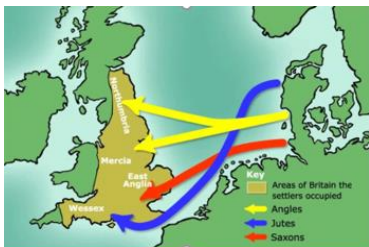

Word	Meaning
Anglo Saxons	The Anglo-Saxons were people who inhabited Great Britain from the 5th century
Angles	Tribes from modern day Denmark who settled in the Eastern part of Britain
Saxons	Tribes from Scandinavia and Germany who settled in south-east Britain
Jutes	A Germanic tribe which settled in southern Britain
Scots	People from Ireland who were fierce and powerful fighters who settled in Scotland
Vikings	People from Scandinavia who settled in the north of Britain in the 8 th Century
Pagan	The religion of the Anglo-Saxons. They believed in many gods
Monastery	A building where monks live and worship
Convert	Change
Fertile land	Land which is able to support a large amount of plants
Danegeld	A tax paid to Viking raiders to stop them invading
Primary source	Historical evidence from the time
Secondary source	Historical evidence compiled after the time

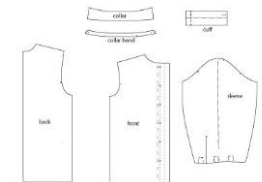


Zigzag Stitch
