
Thursday 7th March marks World Book Day, a celebration of literature and imagination. We have a variety of engaging activities planned to ignite our students' love for reading and storytelling.




World Book Day

World Book Day takes place next week on **Thursday 7th March**. To celebrate this special day, children throughout school are invited to attend school dressed in their pyjamas or come as their favourite book character.

Local Elections

Elections will be taking place in Knowsley on **Thursday 2 May 2024**. This includes local elections as well as the election of the Combined Authority Mayor and the Merseyside Police and Crime Commissioner. To vote in these elections, you must be registered to vote by 11.59pm on Tuesday 16 April 2024. If you've never registered, have moved address or changed your name, register to vote online at:

www.gov.uk/register-to-vote

Once you are registered, there are a number of different ways you can vote:

Postal vote: If you are not already registered for a postal vote, you need to do so by 5pm on Wednesday 17 April 2024. You can apply online for a postal vote by visiting the Government's website. You will be asked to provide your National Insurance Number. If you are already registered for a postal vote, you don't need to do anything. You will be contacted by the Election Team when your postal vote is due for renewal.

Voting by Proxy: If you are unable to vote in person and would like someone to vote on your behalf, you can apply for a proxy vote. The deadline for applications is 5pm on Wednesday 17 April. You can request a proxy vote application by contacting Knowsley's Elections Team on 0151 443 2222 or by emailing:

elections@knowsley.gov.uk

Voting in person at a Polling Station: If you are voting in person on Thursday 2 May, please remember to bring a valid photo ID with you. If you don't have a valid ID, you can apply for a Voter Authority Certificate up until 5pm on Wednesday 24 April. Apply online on the Government's website.

Public Health - Measles

Public Health Knowsley has asked school to alert families to the rising cases of measles in England, a concerning issue particularly in Knowsley due to low Measles Mumps and Rubella (MMR) vaccination rates. Measles is a highly contagious and serious illness. MMR vaccination is safe and highly effective in preventing measles. Recent research from the UK Health Security Agency (UKHSA) indicates that Knowsley may face a measles outbreak if vaccination rates don't improve.

Your child should receive the MMR vaccine at 13 months and again at around 3 years and 4 months, before starting school. Older children, teenagers and young adults who missed their vaccinations can still receive the MMR vaccine for free. Measles symptoms include cough, runny nose, red sore eyes and a spotty rash that starts on the face and spreads to the body.

If you suspect your child has measles, contact your GP for advice. Do not visit without calling ahead to prevent spreading the virus. Keep symptomatic individuals away from others and avoid school, nursery or work for 5 days after the rash appears.
