Entry Task

Look at a range of mosaic artwork by Antoni Gaudi and Laurel True. Rank these in order of preference. Explain in detail which artist's work is your favourite, referring to the visual and tactile elements of art.

Experiment with fragments of polished coloured glass / mosaic tiles. Place complimentary and contrasting colours alongside each other. What is the effect? How might I use my understanding in my composition? Where might I use contrasting / complimentary colours? Why?

Using small paper squares and printing sticks, create viewfinder studies of mosaic border designs. What do you notice about repeating patterns? How can we create accurate designs using mosaic paper squares? Printing sticks?
