Entry Task

Look at a range of artwork that contains spirals (Celtic art, Gustav Klimt, Japanese art). Rank these in order of preference.

Are dinosaurs still alive or **extinct**?
When did they live?

Can I select my favourite piece of ammonite artwork?
Can I identify visual elements including line and colour?

What is a fossil? Where are they found?
What do we call someone who studies fossils?

Enquiry: How do we know that dinosaurs existed?

Who is Mary Anning? Why is she **significant**?
What did she discover?

How did where Mary Anning live impact on her discoveries?

What to revisit?

ELG: Past and Present children will have some understanding of the past through settings, characters and events encountered in books read in class and storytelling.

Threads

legacy, extinct, significance, humanity, adaptation

Why did Mary Anning not get credit for her discoveries until recently?
What is her **legacy**?
What impact did it have on **humanity**? How have womens' rights changed since this time?

Which other **significant** women helped to change the world? How did Rosa Parks change the world?

Big Question

How do we know that dinosaurs existed?
How can this tell us what they ate?

Which animals today are omnivores?

Can I sort animals by what they eat? How have their teeth **adapted**?

Which dinosaurs were omnivores?

Which animals today are herbivores?

What is sculpture? How is it different to a painting?

Which dinosaurs were herbivores?

What techniques can I use to create sculpture? Experiment with modelling clay, papers, cards wires and strings. How can I create texture?

Which animals today are carnivores?

Using the techniques I have learnt can I create my own paleo art that is textured?

Did all dinosaurs eat meat? Which dinosaurs were carnivores?
