Exploring our school grounds, identifying human and physical features, mapping symbols. Identifying features of our school grounds from an aerial photograph

History: (Y1): Local train stations- symbols, significant people: Neil Armstrong & Buzz Aldrin

Big Question

Biographical extract: How have explorers shaped our understanding of the world?
What can maps tell us? How?

What is a continent? How many continents are there?

Can I name and locate the continents?

Where are the world's oceans? Can I identify continents and oceans on maps, globes and atlases?

What is an ocean? How many oceans are there?

What is the difference between an ocean and a sea?

Which seas surround the UK?

What is an explorer? Which explorers of the past have used the seas to discover new lands?

Who was Leif Ericson and why was he significant historically?

Can I explore the geography of our school by conducting fieldwork using my observational skills?

Can I look at maps of our local area, recognising how symbols and a key are used to show different features?

Can I use a map of our community to navigate, mark and describe the route to Court Hey Park using compass directions, locational and directional language?

Why did explorers use maps? Can I devise my own map of our school and grounds using symbols and a key?

Who was Ferdinand Magellan and why was he significant historically? When did he live in comparison to Ericson?

Enquiry: What might have caused changes in exploration & what was the effect? Can I compare and contrast tools used for exploration & navigation, now and in the past? Can I make predictions about artefacts, considering their purpose?

Who was James Cook and why was he significant historically? When did he live in comparison to Ericson and Magellan?

Can I place the explorers I have learnt about into chronological order based on when they lived? Can I also include Neil Armstrong and Ellen MacArthur?

Celebration / Evaluation

To write a diary entry about a time when I have discovered uncharted territory.
