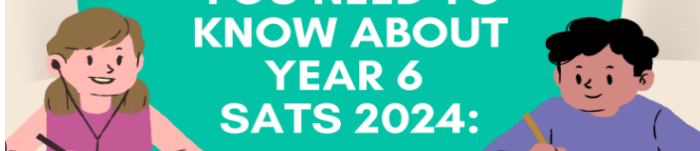
Year 6 SATs Parent Meeting
