





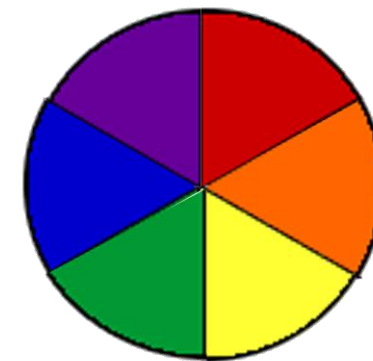
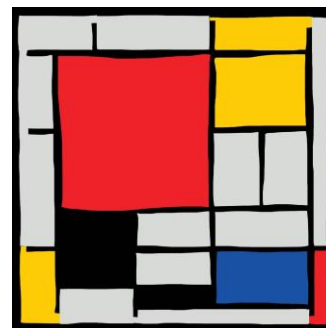


Piet Mondrian

<p>Who is Piet Mondrian?</p>	<p>Piet Mondrian was a Dutch painter who was famous for his abstract art.</p>
<p>What are the primary colours?</p> 	<p>The primary colours are red, blue and yellow. They are called primary colours because they cannot be made with mixtures of other colours. They can be mixed to create secondary colours.</p>
<p>What is a tint?</p>	<p>A tint is where an artist adds white to a colour to create a lighter version of the colour.</p>
<p>What are geometric shapes?</p> 	<p>Examples of geometric shapes are squares, rectangles, triangles and circles.</p>
<p>What are organic shapes?</p> 	<p>Organic shapes are shapes from nature, without a real name. They often have curved lines, like leaves or flowers.</p>

<p>Red</p> 	<p>scarlet, crimson, maroon</p>
<p>Blue</p> 	<p>navy, azure, teal, sapphire</p>
<p>Yellow</p> 	<p>corn, lemon, mustard</p>

<p>abstract</p>	<p>Abstract art doesn't show things from real life. It uses shapes, colours and lines to create effect.</p>
